SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MISSISSIPPI AIRPORTS ASSOCIATION

February 6, 2025

BE IT REMEMBERED, that the Board of Directors (the "Board") of the Mississippi Airports Association (the "Association") convened a special meeting (the "Meeting") of the Board at 1:00 p.m. on February 6, 2025 in the first floor conference room at Lefleur's Bluff Tower, 4780 I-55 North, Jackson, Mississippi 39211, in accordance with Section 6.4.2 of the Bylaws of the Association.

1. ROLL CALL AND DECLARATION OF QUORUM.

President Kirkpatrick called the Meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. and called the roll of Directors. The following Directors were present and participated in the Meeting:

President Kirkpatrick noted that a quorum was present and declared that the Meeting was competent to proceed with the business identified on the Agenda attached to these Minutes as Attachment 1.

2. APPROVAL OF DECEMBER 9, 2024 BOARD MEETING MINUTES.

The first matter to come before the Board was consideration of the minutes of the Special Meeting of the Board of Directors held on December 9, 2024. After discussion, upon motion duly made by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Forster, the Board unanimously approved the Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Board held on December 9, 2024. President Kirkpatrick directed that the Minutes be filed in the Minute Book of the Association.

3. PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

President Kirkpatrick thanked everyone that was able to participate in the meeting. President Kirkpatrick welcomed new Directors Austin Jenkins and Tom Williams (home sick) to the Board.

President Kirkpatrick stated that he thought the Association's Legislative Day at the Capitol had gone very well.

President Kirkpatrick further indicated that he had met with Transportation Commissioner Caldwell regarding the legacy Multimodal Improvement Program ("SMIP") and the newer Strategic Multimodal Investments Fund ("SMIF") and had met, together with Clint Johnson, with Transportation Commissioner Willie Simmons. Both were very receptive to continuing the legacy MMIP, but Commissioner Simmons stated he would not be receptive to increasing the funds allocated to MMIP. Additionally, President Kirkpatrick noted the had met with Rep. Trey Lamar and Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) Executive Director Brad White about funding for airports.

President Kirkpatrick stated that Matt Owens had left the Laurel Airport and would, therefore, no longer be on the Board.

4. TREASURER'S REPORT.

The next matter to come before the Board was the Finance Report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes as Attachment 2. Mr. Forster noted that the Association is in a very good financial position with adequate cash on hand with only 20% of membership fees for the year collected thus far.

Mr. Forster indicated that he would continue to push for greater membership in the Association and would be preparing a list of non-member airports that he would circulate to the Board. Each Director could then identify individuals at any non-member airports with which he or she has a relationship to solicit interest in joining the Association.

Following discussion, Mr. Clay Williams moved, and Mr. Jenkins seconded, that the Board accept the Finance Report attached to these minutes as Attachment 2. There being no further discussion, President Kirkpatrick called for a vote on the matter with all Directors present voting in the affirmative.

5. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT.

The next matter to come before the Board was the Executive Director's report. Ms. Kenne noted that this is traditionally a quiet time of the year for the Association with most of her activities related to membership issues and planning for the next Annual Conference.

6. **COMMITTEE REPORTS.**

2025 Annual Conference and Meeting. Α.

Ms. Kenne reminded everyone that the 2025 Conference will be in Hattiesburg. Ms. Keene indicated that plans for the Conference were coming together, and that the Conference Committee had been discussing several changes. One change would involve moving presentations by the Federal Aviation Administration and MDOT to the first day of the Conference rather than their traditional positions on the last day. The second change would be

distributing all door prizes on Friday morning rather than throughout the Conference. Finally, Ms. Kenne noted that the Committee is working on a roundtable discussion on lobbying that would include Rosa Beckett, Clay Williams, Tom Williams and one or more of their lobbyists.

B. 2026 Annual Conference and Meeting.

Ms. Kenne reminded the Board that the 2026 Annual Conference will be on the coast.

C. Legislative Committee.

Mr. Williams stated that members of the Committee had met with all three Transportation Commissioners to discuss how MMIP is more appropriate for airports than SMIF.

Mr. Wiliams thanked Kirsten Shaw for producing the handouts for the Legislative Day at the Capitol. Mr. Williams stated that he thought very well and would hope the Association would continue the event.

Finally, Mr. Williams noted that House Bill 1 is the bill everyone should watch in the Legislature this year. In addition to making some pretty broad changes to the tax system in Mississippi, it would create a dedicated income string from the lottery for MMIP.

Mr. Wagner advised the Board that he had distributed a list of pending bills that may be of interest to airports, a copy of which is attached as Attachment 3.

7. OLD BUSINESS.

There was no Old Business for the Board to consider.

8. NEW BUSINESS.

There was no New Business for the Board to consider.

ADJOURNMENT.

There being no further business to come before the Meeting, upon motion duly made, seconded, and unanimously adopted, the Meeting adjourned at 2:10 p.m.

LEGISLATION OF INTEREST

MISSISSIPPI AIRPORTS ASSOCIATIONS LEGISLATION OF INTEREST - 2025

BILL	SUBJECT
HB 1 – "Build Up Mississippi Act"	Various tax changes; provides for division of lottery proceeds received by the state – the Strategic Multimodal Investments Fund would share at the rate of 50% for any amount in excess of \$100,000,000 in annual collections
HB 19	Provides procedure for a governing authority to opt out of reverse auction if the governing authority determines it is in the best interest of the political subdivision
HB 184	Would allow purchases not exceeding \$10,000 to be made without bidding; would require solicitation of bids without advertisement (<i>i.e.</i> , "quotes") for purchases greater than \$10,000 but not greater than \$75,000.
	Provides procedure for governing authority to opt out of reverse auction if the governing authority determines it is in the best interest of the political subdivision
HB 697	Provides an exemption from state income tax for the first \$15,000 in income for certified law enforcement officers, certified firefighters and emergency medical technicians.
HB 917	Provides an exemption under the Public Records Act for information relating to a development project in the possession of any public body (previously only applied to the Mississippi Development Authority)
HB 1091	Would allow any veteran of the military services to park without charge at any airport.
HB 1261	Allows for the sale of naming rights in connection with public- private partnerships for transportation projects
SB 2079	Extends the repealer on energy efficiency contracts entered into under MISS. CODE ANN. §31-7-14 to July 1, 2029.
SB 2208	Provides a minimum sentence of five (5) years for making terroristic threats against an airport.
SB 2227	Would create a commission to study the impact of wind turbines on agriculture, including agricultural aviation. Does not address other aviation.

BILL	SUBJECT
SB 2271	Would move the Mississippi Wireless Commission under the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency.
SB 2298	Provides process for prequalification of bidders on projects with a cost of \$10,000,000 or more.
SB 2300	Provides requirements for solicitation of design-build contracts; mainly affects contracts solicited by the Institutions of Higher Learning.
SB 2431	Provides for additional/follow-up drug testing for certified law enforcement officers before losing certification.
SB 2434	Allows local governments to enter into installation-support agreements with the US military.
SB 2574	Authorizes lump sum payment at completion of project in lieu of payment and performance bonds for public contracts of \$50,000 or less.
SB 2578	Would exempt personal text messages from the Mississippi Public Records Act.
SB 2582	Would create sales tax diversion study committee to determine the appropriate allocation between municipalities and The Department of Revenue.
SB 2830	Would allow purchases not exceeding \$15,000 to be made without bidding; would allow solicitation of bids without advertisement for purchases greater than \$15,000 but not greater than \$75,000.
SB 2853	Would extend the repealer on MISS. CODE ANN. §27-7-22.7 providing for an income tax credit for certain uses of ports or airports to July 1, 2029.
SB 2856	Would provide that any project that the Mississippi Development Authority determines is a "capital improvements" project to qualify for the Local Governments Capital Improvements Loan Program.
SB 2860	Provides certain changes to the "Construction Manager" form of public construction contracting.

NEXT DEADLINE – February 13, 2025 – deadline for floor action on bills originating in own house.
